Buck Out Cancer

After a horse show one night, over a glass of wine, two women decided to fight back against the disease each had previously taken on and beaten. Ann Kristine Hedlund and Christine Taggart, both cancer survivors, initiated the first annual 'Buck Out Cancer' charity horse show in June 2004.

A committee of five organized the day-long event which included riding, driving and vaulting demonstrations, a question and answer period with a vet, a drag fox hunt, medieval jousting, a miniature horse show, golfing, silent auctions, dinner and more.

It was held at Taggart's Tillanna Equestrian Centre in Moffat, ON, and raised \$46,000 to improve quality of comfort for cancer patients at the Jurvinski Cancer Centre, where both women received treatment.

Although there is no show planned this year, the duo will return next year with a bang.

Jump for a JustWorld

JustWorld International (JWI) is a non-profit organization registered in

New York state, dedicated to educating young people on social justice around the globe and empowering them to make a difference. Student interns travel to Cambodia, Honduras and Senegal to work with underprivileged children.

As an accomplished equestrian at the age of 23, JWI's executive director Jessica Newman decided to redirect her energy to humanitarianism, leaving the grand prix circuit behind. Not long after, she devised a way to bring her passions together.

Newman founded 'Jump for a JustWorld' to raise funds for JWI as well as to encourage equestrian athletes to get involved. Affiliated athletes donate their time and often a percentage of their winnings to JWI, in addition to serving as spokespeople and visiting project sites. Canadian ambassadors and members of the JWI Show Jumping Team include Eric Lamaze and Angela Covert as well as Junior Team member Marlee Dichter.

In January 2004, JWI's first annual fundraiser, a training show, raised nearly \$100,000. This year, more than 20 JWI equestrian events will be held in Europe, the U.S. and Canada.
